This mini-course will introduce some foundations for understanding tonal phenomena in natural language. Throughout the course, we will engage with spoken data from the course participants and audio files from diverse languages. Class 1 will introduce tonal phenomena, issues with representing tones, and the concept of tonal association in autosegmental representations. Class 2 will introduce the concept of accent and a perspective for disentangling tone, stress, and accent. Class 3 will introduce the idea of phonological chunks/edges and both motivate and challenge how these have been represented in the grammar.
